Otero College has long partnered with ESCALA, the premier professional development organization serving Hispanic Serving Institutions. Otero received our designation as a HSI in 2009 and is one of 14 higher education institutions in the state of Colorado to carry this banner. Over the last decade, Otero College has sent 25 faculty members to participate in ESCALA's program aimed to dismantle systemic racism.
